CLASS POLICY & PROCEDURES

ATTENDANCE

Students are expected to attend scheduled classes consistently to be given credit for that year. Make-up work can be arranged with the program coordinator for the child's grade level. Students should be in their classroom a couple of minutes before classes begin but should **NOT** enter the classroom if the teacher is not there yet.

If students will be absent from class, parents or guardians are asked to contact the Faith Formation office before or during class time (725-0660).

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

Our Faith Formation Program takes place in a Catholic Christian setting. We strive to not only teach about the Christian way of life and values, but also to help our students live them. We expect consideration and respect for teachers, other students, and parish property from all children involved in our program. Teachers will explain classroom and program expectations at the beginning of the school year.

CANCELLING CLASSES

If the NEENAH public schools or St. Mary Catholic Schools are cancelled for the day or let out early due to weather, Faith Formation classes for that evening will be cancelled. If Faith Formation classes are to be cancelled (without Neenah Public Schools cancelling), we will try to make that decision by 2 p.m. We will also send notifications via Flocknote Text and Email and post the cancellation on the St. Gabriel website. As always, we ask you, as a parent, to be the judge of driving in hazardous weather.

ENTRANCE AND DISMISSAL

Students in Grades 1-10 are asked to enter and exit through the West doors (Green Bay Road parking lot) of the school building. Confirmation, Grade 11 programs enter and leave through doors between the church and Stingle Hall (drive-up/drop-off carport area for church).

PROCEDURE FOR WITHDRAWAL

Please contact the Faith Formation office as soon as you know you will be leaving the program for any reason. We will follow the schedule below for refunds on tuition if proper advance notification is given:

Before 1st Class Full refund of tuition/Sacrament Fees

Before January 1 Half of tuition refunded

After January 1 No Refund

HOME STUDY

Home study for Faith Formation classes is available for families who cannot attend regular Faith Formation classes. This option is available upon request and acceptance by the Faith Formation staff. A contract for home study must be filled out and returned to the Faith Formation Office. Children in the home study program must meet with a Faith Formation staff person on a regular basis. Families are expected to attend all family events listed in this handbook. Regular tuition & fees apply. Home Study is not offered for 2nd Grade and Confirmation (Grades 9-11).

CLASS SAFETY ISSUES

PARKING

Please read the following information on Parking Lot Safety and look at the map very carefully. All drivers and children are asked to be especially vigilant, so as to avoid any accidents. Also, please do not block the entrance to the parking lot or school. This is a fire lane. The safety of our children is a primary concern for parents and teachers alike. It is essential that we all cooperate to make this process safe and orderly.

<u>PLEASE</u> take a moment to read and abide by the following guidelines for **anyone** doing drop-off or pick-up of a FAITH FORMATION student.

- 1. There is **NO PARKING** in the area in front of the school doors. If you are parking your car, please do so in the painted lines further away from the doors.
- 2. ENTER the parking lot ONLY from the long drive on Green Bay Road, or via the lot entrance from Geiger Street. Follow the 'One Way' signs.
- 3. EXIT the parking lot ONLY via the drive onto Geiger Street.
- 4. ALWAYS be attentive for any pedestrians making their way to and from the building and vehicles. This will be especially critical during the fall and winter afternoons/evenings when it gets dark earlier, and/or the parking lot is slippery.
- 5. DO NOT allow your children to RUN freely/unattended through the parking lot. Remind one another every week to be careful when getting to and from class.

SUPERVISION & SECURITY

Students will be supervised during all class times by an adult volunteer or member of the Faith Formation staff. Children are not to be dropped off more than 15 minutes before class, and must be picked up promptly after class. Please contact the Faith Formation Office if your child will be early or late for drop off or pick up. We are not responsible for students outside of class times. We suggest younger children be escorted to/from their classroom by parents or an older sibling.

Our building security includes an electronic entry system and camera access. We know you understand the reasons for these measures, and we depend upon all parents and families to help safeguard the security of our children. We ask for your patience, your awareness of those around you, and your cooperation in not propping open doors or other actions that undermine our building safety. Please communicate any concerns to Victor Meschi in the Faith Formation Office.

ALCOHOL & OTHER DRUGS OR WEAPONS

Any use or possession of alcohol, non-prescription drugs, or weapons is strictly prohibited while on parish & school grounds or during any Faith Formation sponsored event. It should be understood by parents, students, employees and volunteer staff that all violations of municipal, state, or federal rules will be enforced by the Faith Formation staff.

SMOKING ON SCHOOL PREMISES

St. Gabriel Parish and School is a smoke-free, tobacco-free facility. No smoking by anyone is allowed on parish/school premises at any time. Any smoking shall be reported to the Coordinator of the Faith Formation program who has authority to take appropriate action.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICIES

Staff & Volunteers—as part of the nationwide effort to maintain safe environments for children/young people and vulnerable adults involved in our Catholic parishes, schools, and programs, a specialized training program is offered through the Diocese of Green Bay. All employees, all clergy, and those volunteers in contact with children and young people are required to participate in a VIRTUS *Protecting God's Children* Adult Awareness Session. Furthermore, the comprehensive measures being taken to create a safer environment include an on-line application process, checking of references, and criminal background screenings.

Children & Youth—during the course of the program year, parents can expect that their children will have the equivalent of at least one hour of instructional time devoted to protective behaviors for themselves. While some of the material is similar to what is mandated and offered in the public school setting, the content also emphasizes our dignity as children of God, and a Catholic Christian understanding of healthy relationships.

CLASS CONTENT FOR GRADES 1-11

Grade 1

Goals: That the child discovers that each person is called through Baptism to be a disciple of Jesus and a member of God's family, recognizes that God is Creator of all, learns about Jesus and how to live as Jesus did, and experiences the Church as God's Family.

Parents' Responsibilities

- 1. Teach your child these prayers:
 - Sign of the Cross, Hail Mary, (Our Father) Lord's Prayer, & Glory Be
- 2. Pray spontaneously as a family at meals and/or bedtime, birthdays, etc.
- 3. Attend weekend Mass and celebrate Sundays and special family and church feasts.
- 4. Read/tell Bible stories and listen to the children re-tell them.

Grade 2

Goals: That the child discovers that each person is called as a disciple of Jesus to love, forgive and serve others, understands that Jesus is the fullest expression we have of how much God loves us, understands that Baptism and Eucharist are two of the Church's Sacraments of Initiation and discovers that forgiveness and reconciliation are important parts of the Church's life.

Parents' Responsibilities

- 1. Attend weekend Mass and participate actively with your child.
- 2. Participate in the parish's preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion
- 3. Participate in the retreat for First Reconciliation and the parent/child meeting and retreat for First Communion
- 4. Celebrate your child's First Reconciliation and First Communion
- 5. Read/tell the story of the Last Supper
- 6. Review prayers listed under Grade 1 Parent Responsibilities

Book: We Believe published by Sadlier and Sacramental Preparation Books.

Grade 3/4

Goals: That the child learns that disciples live, celebrate and serve within the People of God, deepens his or her understanding of the Trinity, realizes that he or she is called to follow Jesus as a member of the Catholic Church.

Parents' Responsibilities

- 1. Help your child experience and observe the work of parish ministers.
- 2. Involve your child in a shared service activity.
- 3. Attend Sunday Mass and actively participate with your children.
- 4. Attend Reconciliation with your child.
- 5. Read and tell Bible stories and listen to your child share these stories in his/her own words.
- 6. Review the prayers listed under the Grade 1 Parent Responsibilities and The Apostle's Creed

Book: We Believe published by Sadlier

Grade 5/6

Goal: That the child becomes a disciple of Jesus Christ, learns that we meet Jesus in the sacraments, prays as Jesus taught us to pray, celebrates that Jesus is present in the sacraments, learns to love the Mass chooses to love and serve as Jesus did, shares in the Church's mission by giving witness to their faith and lives out the sacraments by being faithful and inviting others to follow Jesus.

Parents' Responsibilities

- 1. Help your child understand and memorize the Nicene Creed.
- 2. Attend weekend Mass and other liturgical celebrations.
- 3. Take an active part in the sacraments of our Church.
- 4. Discuss issues of peace and justice with your child.
- 5. Continue to pray with your child.

Grade 7/8

EDGE

Goal: To help teens have a personal encounter and develop a relationship with Jesus Christ. Youth will participate in subjects including the Creed, Morality, Sacraments, and the Liturgy.

Parents' Responsibilities

- 1. Participate in the Mass on Weekends and Holy Days with your child.
- 2. Include prayer for and with your children as part of your daily life.
- 3. Increase your child's awareness of conflicts in the community or world and how these situations might be addressed from a Gospel perspective.
- 4. Talk to your child about how faith relates to everyday life.

Grades 9-11

Confirmation Prep

The goal of our Confirmation preparation program is to equip students to be disciples of Jesus Christ through prayer, active participation in the sacraments, and service and foster a desire to know Jesus and love Jesus better throughout their lives. With guidance from the Diocese of Green Bay and a wide range of curriculum materials, students will learn how to apply Catholic teaching to everyday life and live in the joy of the Gospel.

In the 11th Grade year, students will begin immediate Confirmation Prep. The Green Bay Diocese requires two years of Catholic Education before beginning immediate Confirmation Prep, either in Faith Formation or a Catholic School. All Confirmation students are required to attend an overnight Confirmation retreat in Junior year, scheduled by the Faith Formation office. If the student is unable to attend the scheduled retreat, we will work together to find a suitable alternative. Additionally, students will need a Confirmation Sponsor. As defined by Canon Law, a Confirmation sponsor must be more than 16 years of age, a confirmed, practicing Catholic, and cannot be the candidate's parent. Students will be asked to work closely with their sponsor throughout their time of preparation, and sponsors will be required to attend the Confirmation Mass. The date for the Confirmation Mass is set by the Diocese of Green Bay, and is usually available in August. St.

Gabriel will celebrate the Confirmation Mass with area parishes, as directed by the Bishop. The Bishop of Green Bay or the Abbot of St. Norbert Abbey will be the Celebrant of the Mass.

Goals: Following the directives of the Green Bay diocese, we will follow the curriculum guides in order to help teens come to an understanding of the fullness of faith, which ultimately is rooted in a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. The teens will be able to integrate the teachings of Scripture & Church into their life decisions, grow in their understanding of Jesus as the Jesus of History and the Lord of Faith, can name and describe the main qualities and virtues of Jesus as revealed by His words and actions, recorded in the Gospels, apply the example of Jesus in a personal effort to be more responsive to the needs of those around them, understand the nature of faith as a personal relationship with God, through their baptism as disciples of Jesus.

Parents' Responsibilities

- 1. Participate in the weekend Mass and Holy Day Liturgies with your children.
- 2. Engage in discussion that examines the problems facing society and our role as Catholics in helping to resolve them. In the process, help your child identify ways in which he or she can serve the parish and the community.
- 3. Participate with your child in the parish Reconciliation Services and Service Projects during Advent and Lent in addition to parent designated classes throughout the course of the year.
- 4. Engage in family prayer.

Grade 11 2026 Confirmation

As we adjust our Confirmation Prep program to be a three year study, our current (2025-26) 11th graders will continue with the prep program they began with. Classes for this year will be separate from the High School classes and focus on immediate Sacramental Prep.

The goal of our Confirmation preparation program is to equip students to be disciples of Jesus Christ through prayer, active participation in the sacraments, and service and foster a desire to know Jesus and love Jesus better throughout their lives. With guidance from the Diocese of Green Bay and a wide range of curriculum materials, students will learn how to apply Catholic teaching to everyday life and live in the joy of the Gospel.

All Confirmation students are required to attend a Confirmation retreat, scheduled by the Faith Formation office. If the student is unable to attend the scheduled retreat, we will work together to find a suitable alternative. Additionally, students will need a Confirmation Sponsor. As defined by Canon Law, a Confirmation sponsor must be more than 16 years of age, a confirmed, practicing Catholic, and cannot be the candidate's parent. Students will be asked to work closely with their sponsor throughout their time of preparation, and sponsors will be required to attend the Confirmation Mass. Opportunities through the year will be available for parents and/or sponsors to attend classes with their candidate.

The date for the Confirmation Mass is set by the Diocese of Green Bay, and is usually available in August. St.

Gabriel will celebrate the Confirmation Mass with area parishes, as directed by the Bishop. The Bishop of Green Bay or the Abbot of St. Norbert Abbey will be the Celebrant of the Mass.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION PROGRAMS

IMPORTANT NOTE:

If your child is over the age of 6 and has not been baptized, all children must be baptized before receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist or Confirmation. For Baptism preparation of children older than 2nd grade please contact Charlie Mares at the Parish Office (722-4914).

Any child who has not received these sacraments at the customary times (Grade 2 for First Eucharist, and First Reconciliation, and Grade 11 for Confirmation) may do so by contacting Tina Peirick or Victor Meschi in the Faith Formation office.

FIRST RECONCILIATION

The practice in the Diocese of Green Bay is to prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) prior to receiving First Communion. This means that most children will prepare in Grade 2. The preparation program begins in <u>October</u> with a meeting for parents. We use the textbook, <u>Signs of Grace: You are Forgiven.</u> A handbook is given out to help families prepare for the celebration. The children are prepared at home and in Faith Formation sessions. Please consult the calendar for dates of meetings and the celebration of First Reconciliation.

FIRST EUCHARIST

Children in Second Grade and older who have not received Communion and have been baptized are eligible for First Eucharist, provided they have completed at least one year of Faith Formation. The preparation program begins in <u>January</u> with a meeting for parents. The textbook will be distributed, as well as a handbook for parents to help families prepare for the celebration. The children are prepared at home and in FAITH FORMATION sessions. Families will select a Mass time on a designated weekend to celebrate the sacrament. It is expected that children will have completed Grade 1 (or at least one year, if an older student) in FAITH FORMATION, Catholic School or another setting prior to beginning preparation for First Eucharist. This gives the child better grounding in and knowledge of the faith, learning and memorization of prayers, etc.

CONFIRMATION

High Schoolers Grades 9-11 Participate in Confirmation Prep. Through attending monthly group meetings, as well as classes, students prepare for Confirmation in their Junior year. To be eligible, students must be in High School, be Baptized, and have received their First Communion. Junior and Seniors who have not been Confirme are eligible to participate in the Immediate Prep Program and receive Confirmation in the Spring. All students **MUST** have participated in 2 prior years of religious education training (Grades 9 & 10) in Faith Formation or at

a Catholic High School before beginning their final year of Prep. **Please Note: Confirmation Preparation is NOT part of Catholic High School Curriculum. Confirmation is prepared for at the parish of membership. Candidates who wish to prepare for Confirmation at a parish outside of their parish of membership should speak with the Confirmation Coordinator and Priest at the parish of membership before enrolling in another parish. Candidates select a sponsor who works with them throughout the final stages of the preparation process. The Confirmation Liturgy is scheduled by the Office of the Bishop of the Diocese of Green Bay and is generally published in the Summer prior to the year of Confirmation.

In the 2025-26 School Year, Confirmation Candidates must have completed two prior years of religious education (Faith Formation or Catholic High School). Candidates will prepare through the Confirmation Prep Program on Sunday evenings.

TUITION, FEES AND FUND-RAISING

TUITION

The majority of the budget for the Faith Formation Program is subsidized by the parish. We ask that you, as parish members, help supplement the cost of tuition through your sacrificial giving. Parents are asked to pay 25% of the total cost of the program with the parish paying the remaining 75%. The budget includes textbooks, teaching supplies, office supplies, audio-visual materials, teacher training, capital outlay, salaries for Faith Formation staff, plus 15% of the operating cost of the building.

Tuition is \$140.00 per child for parish members with a maximum of \$420.00 per family.

We ask that all tuition be paid by April 1, 2026. Anyone who needs more time, or assistance with payment, can contact Tina Peirick at the Faith Formation office (725-0660). Any requests for exemptions will be held in the strictest confidence.

RETREAT AND MATERIALS FEES

For students receiving Sacraments, there is a fee to cover the costs of additional materials and retreats. While there is no fee to receive the actual Sacraments, these fees help us to provide the best preparation experience for each student. No student will be denied a sacrament due to costs, and there is assistance available for those who may need it. Please contact Tina Peirick at 920-725-0660 for additional information.

TEXTBOOK Rental

Textbooks are on a book rental system. Texts can be taken home after every class but remain the property of the Faith Formation program. All textbooks are to be returned at the end of the school year. A charge of \$20-\$25 will be assessed for a lost or damaged book. Students in Grades 7-11 are using consumable materials, which are theirs to keep unless otherwise specified.

Fundraising/SCRIP CREDITS

St. Gabriel Parish offers Scrip – a year-round fundraising benefit for all St. Gabriel families and parishioners!

Here's how Scrip works: Purchase gift cards for your favorite retailers at face value through raiseright.com or the RaiseRight app. The retailers give specified rebates back to St. Gabriel and 80% of those rebates can be

directed to family tuition accounts, school programs or our parish. The remaining 20% is used to cover expenses associated with the Scrip program and as a SMCS fundraiser for tuition assistance.

Faith formation families have two options to earn tuition credit.

- 1. ONLINE RAISERIGHT: Faith formation families earn 80% of the profit generated by their purchase when they order online or through the RaiseRight app. Each retailer offers their own discount so tuition credit varies depending on what you purchase. See how to create an online account below.
- 2. <u>IN STOCK PURCHASE:</u> Faith formation families earn 2% tuition credit on every Scrip purchase from <u>in</u> <u>stock</u> purchases for example: purchase \$100 of gift cards (gas, grocery, etc.) and earn \$2.00 tuition credit; \$400 purchase = \$8.00 credit. Scrip can be purchased in the parish office during the week or at the Scrip desk after weekend Masses. Just be sure to circle "faith formation" on your purchase form. It's that easy! Payment can be made by cash or check and the credits can add up quickly.

Enroll today and start earning Scrip credit toward faith formation tuition, sacramental fees, or mission trips. Set up your Scrip Account:

- 1. **Create your online Scrip account** and search participating retailers by downloading the RaiseRight app.
- 2. Click Sign Up and then Join a program where you will input this enrollment code: SMCS Enrollment code C3A5L2A81144
- 3. **Set up your payment type**. Authorize online payments from your bank account for fast and convenient checkout with a \$0.29 transaction fee or credit cards are now accepted at checkout for a 2.6% transaction fee.
- 4. **Fill out the Scrip User Agreement** and return it to the parish office or scan/email to: luhlenbrauck@smcatholicschools.org in the SMC Business Office. This tells us where you want your cards delivered and where you want the credits to go.
- 5. Shop HUNDREDS of retailers; use Scrip for purchases big and small!

FAITH FORMATION FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

When your child was baptized, he or she began an intimate relationship with Jesus. Your child became one of Jesus' disciples and a member of our Church family. At Baptism you assumed the awesome responsibility to nurture and support your child's growth in discipleship, and it is our honor to support you and your family in your faith journey. As a parent, you are the first teacher of faith to your child, and they will learn the most about their faith from you. The Faith Formation Program at St. Gabriel the Archangel seeks to support your efforts at home, and we ask that you keep us informed of any questions or concerns that may arise throughout the year. Everything we do, at every grade level, has this goal in mind:

Children will discover that each person is special; made in the image and likeness of God, and that all life is a gift from God, who loves us and has a unique plan and purpose for each of us.

In order to achieve this goal, parents/guardians agree to:

- model the faith we seek to share with our children;
- participate regularly in the Eucharist and other parish celebrations with our children;
- provide opportunities in the home for our children to experience family prayer, the celebration of religious and family traditions and works of care and service to others;
- ensure that our children regularly attend classes, Masses and special Parish events planned for them.
- participate in the parent sessions as outlined and scheduled;
- cooperate with our children's catechists and maintain open communication with them
